

What is a “Tafel” ?

What is a “Tafel”?

The Tafel - or harvest store - sells donated groceries and produce cheaply to needy people.

Only goods that have been donated by shops or donors can be sold.

Our refrigerated vehicles collect the donated produce and groceries daily. The goods are then sorted, packed and placed in the shelves.

To buy products you need to have a Tafel-ID-card. To get an ID-card you will need documents like your social security confirmation, pension certificate or salary information.

Religion or country of origin are not relevant. Only your neediness is relevant for your acceptance to the Tafel.

In order to treat all Tafel-customers equally, some rare goods may be limited per person.

You cannot enforce a right to buy in the Tafel.

The Tafel is a volunteer project. The workers are not employed but do this in their spare time.
